# <u>To / Two / Too</u>

Three words with the same pronunciation but different meanings.

## **TO** (preposition)



## **TO** is a preposition that shows movement.

Example:

We're going to the restaurant.

TO shows the infinitive form of a verb.

**Example:** I want to eat chocolate ice cream.

## Too (adverb)



**TOO** is an adverb that can mean excessively.

Example:

I ate too much pizza.

TOO means "also," "as well," or "additionally."

Example:

I want a hamburger too.





TWO is simply the number 2. Examples: I ordered two slices of pizza.

I have two sisters.
